



Evolution of the neo-liberal global "free market" economic system





Liberalisation of the financial markets creates massive fluctuations



5E-economics

I propose that the underlying model of the **neo-liberal global economics** is based upon these 5 Es:

Exploitation of people, other living beings, habitats, ecosystems and common resources (air, water, soil, energy)

Exponential growth in debt finacialised economies measured through *Gross Domesic Product (GDP)* which counts *negative effects*, such as healthcare caused by obiesity from highly processed foods and cleaning up pollution as net positive contributions to GDP


Externalised costs are borne by society and the natural environment i.e. most companies and organisations do not operate on *true cost accounting*)

Exclusion of manual & low-paid labour & slave classes, minorities, dissenters...

Exclusivity whereby the rich operate economies, financial markets and media channels for increased benefits for the rich




5E-economics damages us, other living beings & ecosystem health





Continuous growth in GDP = growth in CO2 & global temperature + decline in biodiversity & ecosystem health


5E-economics: Intensive farm factories are incubating potential virus pandemics











5E-economics: Seems linked to rising incidence of infectious disease outbreaks!





Figure 1. Global number of human infectious disease outbreaks and richness of causal diseases 1980 – 2010. Outbreak records are plotted with respect to (a) total global outbreaks (left axis, bars) and total number of diseases causing outbreaks in each year (right axis, dots), (b) host type, (c) pathogen taxonomy and (d) transmission mode. (Online version in colour.)


5E-economics: Centre-right/right governments tend to reduce spending in state healthcare systems



In the United Kingdom in the last 70 years centre-right/right governments have a tendency to reduce state investment in the National Health System encouraging private companies to offer health care.

This has negatively impacted on the ability of the state healthcare system to respond to the Covid-19 coronavirus crisis with shortages of trained medical personnel, equipment, hospital beds and health infrastructure.




